Welcome to our church!!

I recently came upon a church welcome sign, and I was intrigued with it. I thought it had the attitude of Christ in it. It reads like this:

We extend a special welcome to those who are single, married, divorced, gay, filthy rich, dirt poor. We extend a special welcome to those who are crying new-borns, thin as a rake or could afford to lose a few pounds.

We welcome you if you can sing like Pavarotti or like our Vicar (who can't carry a note in a bucket). You are welcome here if you are 'just browsing', just woke up or just got out of prison. We don't care if you are more religious than the Archbishop of Canterbury, or haven't been in church since little Jack's christening.

We extend a special welcome to those who are over 60 but not grown up yet, and to teenagers who are growing up too fast.
