THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Last weekend, Matthew was invited by his Gran to see the unveiling of a new memorial to Captain Scott in Glen Prosen (30 miles northwest of Dundee). Here, in a nearby cottage, the famous explorer had planned his second polar expedition, to the South Pole, with the naturalist, painter and physician Edward Wilson.

You may well know from history, that Scott and his colleagues travelled to the Antarctic to explore and research what they found in the natural environment of this untouched region. At the same time they sought to be the first men to reach the South Pole. Not only were they beaten by a Norwegian team of explorers, all the men tragically failed to make it back home, dying of cold, exhaustion and starvation, a mere 11 miles from the safety of base camp.

A couple of years ago, at the Discovery exhibition in Dundee, we learned one of the reasons for their failure to survive lay in the design of their clothing. After thorough research and testing, they had chosen to use outfits made from modern, lightweight, man-made materials. Despite the rigorous testing, they proved to be far less superior to the fur and animal skins that clothed and protected the Norwegian team. The Norwegians had chosen their dress using the wisdom of people who had first hand experience of living in arctic conditions and knew how to survive them.

I can't help but draw parallels from this with what I find in God's word. What we choose to 'wear' makes the difference in our receiving eternal life or death. I'm reminded how my salvation and eternal life depends, not on my own efforts, but in 'clothing' myself in Christ's righteousness. He freely offers us His robe of righteousness and we can choose to wear it, or to wear the 'man-made' garments of our own self-righteousness, and our far less superior human wisdom.

"I will greatly rejoice in the LORD, My soul shall be joyful in my God;
For He has clothed me with the garments of salvation,
He has covered me with the robe of righteousness." Isaiah 61:10
